

This investment will also generate a significant amount of income for the Council to help provide services to current and future generations of Middlesbrough residents. This investment is not funded directly from Council Tax, it is funded mainly through land sales, grants and borrowing.

We are now consulting with communities on a Social Regeneration Strategy, to be published later this year. This Strategy will allow local people to share the benefits arising from the physical transformation of Middlesbrough.

How we spend your Middlesbrough £

This is how we spend each £1 on your behalf, of which 23 pence comes from Council Tax:



We provide services to 140,000 people across Middlesbrough and have the lowest average Council Tax per household in the Tees Valley. Your Council Tax contributes 23% towards the cost of the delivery of hundreds of services and initiatives, the rest is funded by government grants, business rates, fees and charges. Our services include:
